Eleven European partner institutions joined together to develop a set of gender sensitive training designs, workshop modules, eLearning settings and single material. Hereby female students shall be supported in their decision making process as well as their career path in the ICT sector.

Development of Webbased Database for Gendersensitive Training Materials and Modules

The training material will be integrated in a webbased database, which can be searched very flexibly and applied by all those persons who train girls and women in the various education and job-orientation phases. Free access will be offered to teachers, educationalists, human resource managers and consultants who play a role in the vocational guidance process.

The Collection targets the following Issues

- ❑ How to raise the awareness in the personal mindset (anticipation) towards an “unconventional occupational choice”?
- ❑ How to match female ways of learning and handling ICT with the requirements of school and university curricula?
- ❑ How to make qualification requirements visible and point out IT vocational career steps?
- ❑ How to prepare graduates for the IT recruitment process and working sphere?
- ❑ How to be an attractive employer for women?

Public Relation and Dissemination

PRO:ICT training material will include eContent in several languages and thus be spread among a strong PRO:ICT network in entire Europe. In particular schools and teacher's training institutions, universities of applied sciences, institutions of vocational guidance as well as Human Resources departments of enterprises get informed.
